Hi Jenni (and everyone else!),

Thanks for your message and for reaching out about this. I'm also including Ms. Hale in my reply since she is Charlie's advisor. It was interesting to see in the email that Charlie sent to all of his teachers that he might not have accessed many of these testing accommodations previously. Before I delve into the other topics, to answer your specific question about a study guide, the students will get a review sheet next week to help them remember what we've covered thus far and target their studying.

I think in a lot of ways, this is really up to Charlie! Even if he doesn't end up needing it, the extended time is always something good to "officially" request, as it's helpful for Learning Support to track that in our students. If it's easier for him to answer questions using a computer vs. writing by hand, that's also something that can be put in place (and this is true for all assignments in my class, not just quizzes). Whether or not he'd like separate testing is totally up to him. Since (if I understand correctly) he's not used to this previously, I think there's a definite value in trying it out, which could certainly happen for our class.

I'm wondering if the best next step would be for Monica to chat about these options with Charlie during GSH this week? She can walk him through what those options are, and what it would look like to utilize some/all of them. Of course, I'm more than happy to do this as well, but it might be better for it to be Monica since these accommodations can come into play in any of his classes.
